UPDATE TO RESPONSE OF UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE
TO MOTION OF AMERICAN BUSINESS MEDIA TO COMPEL RESPONSE
TO INTERROGATORY ABM/USPS-T11-13
(April 13, 2004)

On April 8, 2004, the Postal Service filed its response to American Business Media's (ABM's) motion to compel responses to interrogatories ABM/USPS-T11-11 and 13. Interrogatory ABM/USPS-T1-13 requests the identification of the participants in the current co-palletization experiment. With respect to that interrogatory, the Postal Service stated that not all of the participants had yet responded to the Postal Service's inquiry about whether they would be willing to be identified.

The Postal Service can now report that all but one of the participating printers/consolidators is willing to be identified. The other participant wishes to remain anonymous. ABM has informed undersigned counsel that it would be satisfied if the Postal Service identifies all but the participant who wishes to remain anonymous. With the understanding that the identity of the one participant who wishes to remain

anonymous can be withheld, the Postal Service withdraws its objection to interrogatory ABM/USPS-T1-13, and will provide a response tomorrow.
