The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of its responses to the above-listed interrogatories filed today. The questions were part of a wide-ranging and in-depth set of interrogatories directed to witness Taufique on May 27, 2005. The responses were due to have been filed on June 10, 2005. The filing of the responses five calendar days late is a consequence of the need for internal consultations that could not be completed in time for the filing of a response until today. The Postal Service regrets the delay in the filing of the response, but considers that any prejudice is *de minimis* at best.
