NOTICE OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE REGARDING ERRATA IN  
JUNE 1, 2006, MOTION FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE  
OF FILING OF RESPONSES  
TO OCA INTERROGATORIES (OCA/USPS-35 THROUGH 43)  
(June 5, 2006) [ERRATA]

The United States Postal Service hereby gives notice that its June 1<sup>st</sup> motion for late acceptance of the filing of its responses to Office of the Consumer Advocate interrogatories OCA/USPS-35 through 38 and 41 through 43 was riddled with errors.

It is hard to know where to begin. We could start with the fact that the motion misidentifies the institutional interrogatory responses as being provided by witness Williams. Or we could begin with the fact that the motion misidentifies the interrogatories as OCA/USPS-~~12~~-35 through 43. Or we could start with the fact that the motion misidentifies the interrogatories as ranging between numbers 35 and 43, when the set filed that day only included 35 through 38 and 41 through 43.

Wherever we begin, we end up apologizing to the Commission for having filed so thoroughly confusing a pleading. And reminding all that haste makes waste.
