PRESIDING OFFICER'S RULING GRANTING  
MOTIONS FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE  
OF RESPONSES TO INTERROGATORIES AND  
PRESIDING OFFICER'S INFORMATION REQUEST

(Issued June 16, 2006)

There are six motions pending for late acceptance. In general, the Postal Service claims that lateness was due to delay in consultations among personnel responsible for the subject matter hindering timely preparation of responses. As no party appears to have been prejudiced by the delay, the referenced filings will be accepted.

5. The Motion of the United States Postal Service for Late Acceptance of Filing of Response to Pitney Bowes Interrogatory (PB/USPS-6), filed June 12, 2006, is granted.
6. The Motion of the United States Postal Service for Acceptance of Late Filing of Responses to Association of Priority Mail Users Interrogatories (APMU/USPS-T1-3 and 4), filed June 12, 2006, is granted.
