NOTICE REGARDING
REPLY OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE TO
THE MOTIONS TO COMPEL OF DAVID B. POPKIN (DBP/USPS-151)
(August 2, 2006)

On July 13, the Postal Service objected to the following interrogatory of David B. Popkin, filed on July 3, 2006: DBP/USPS-151. Mr. Popkin filed a motion to compel on July 25. He then filed a supplemental motion to compel on July 26. The latter document identified a possible means of responding to the interrogatory that the Postal Service continues to investigate. That investigation cannot be completed, however, until the return of a key employee from vacation next week. The Postal Service does expect either to reply to the motions to compel, or to respond to the interrogatory. Accordingly, the Postal Service now indicates that such a choice will be made, and acted upon, by August 10, 2006.
