The United States Postal Service hereby provides its responses to the following interrogatories of David B. Popkin be accepted out of time: 419-429, 430(c)-434, 476. The delay was caused by the need to consult with various functional groups, the need to revise draft answers following the revision of footnote 2 in USPS-T-38, and to ensure the consistency of answers with those filed to the interrogatories of other participants. The Postal Service does not believe any party will be prejudiced by the delay, and notes that it has today filed early responses to DBP/USPS-483-487 and 545 on the same subject.
