STATEMENT CONCERNING ISSUES
THAT MAY REQUIRE A HEARING
(September 7, 2007)

In Order No. 25, issued August 10, 2007, the Commission directed participants to identify issues that might require a hearing for resolution. This pleading responds to that order.

The Office of the Consumer Advocate (“OCA”) has filed discovery concerning before-rates volume estimates of Life Line Screening.¹ The OCA is drafting discovery concerning mailer-specific unit costs.² Whether a hearing will be needed to resolve these issues (or other issues that may arise concerning the probable financial effect of
